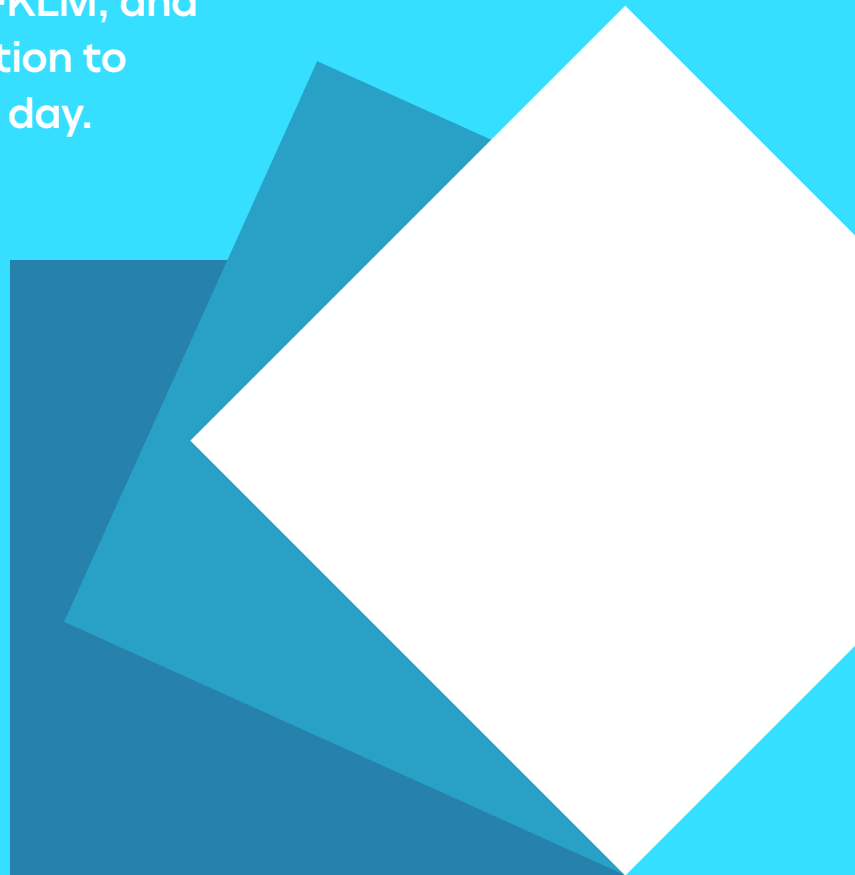

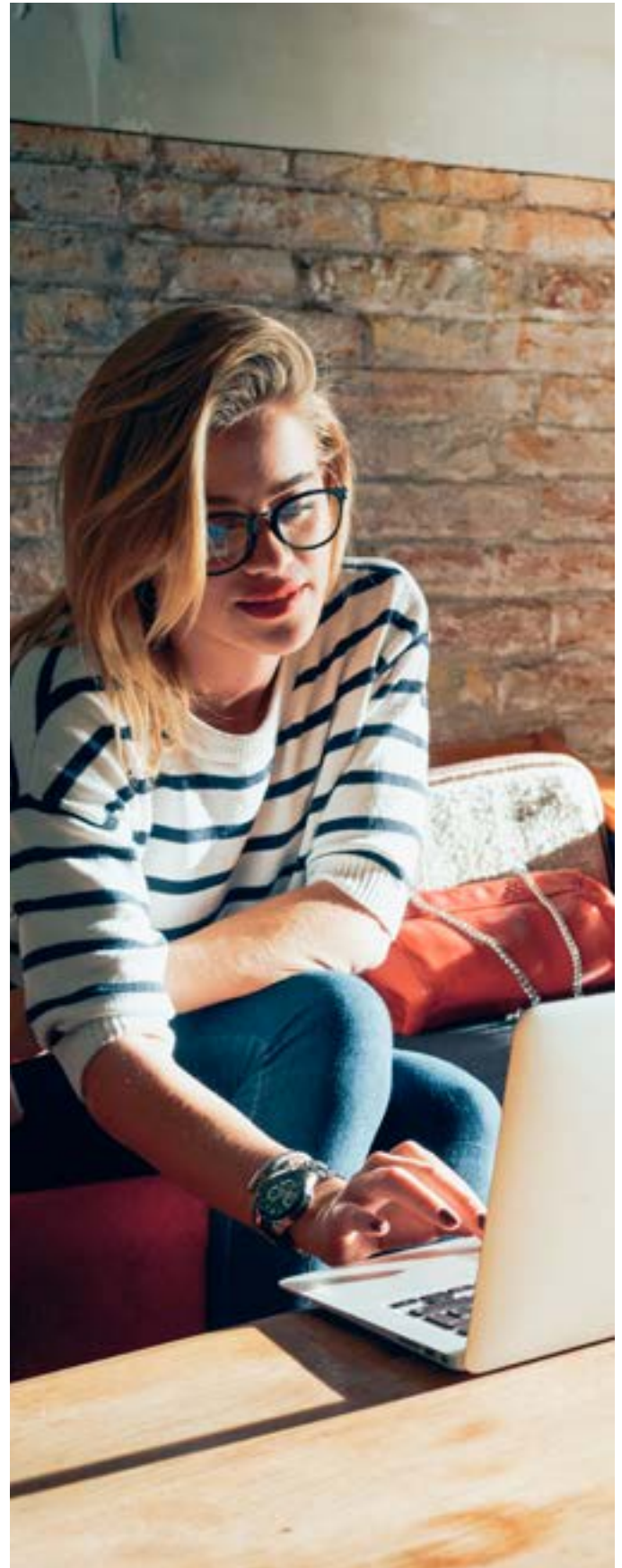
What is AP (Accounts Payable) Automation Software?

With increasing levels of automation, accounts payable teams can focus on more strategic imperatives.

Essentially, AP automation significantly reduces the time and labor involved in paper-based manual accounts payable invoicing, as well as reducing the risk of costly human **errors**. **Better control, increased visibility and higher efficiency are the goals of accounts payable automation.**

Digital payments may even become a revenue source if/when payment is made by vCard. Most importantly for your AP team, payment visibility can be given to your suppliers thereby eliminating the likelihood of having to spend time handling supplier inquiries (as much as 25% of an AP manager's time can be spent taking calls from suppliers).



What are the main benefits of AP invoice automation?



- 1 Lost invoices** — Invoices with the wrong PO number, sent to the wrong address or inbox, with the wrong supplier information creates hours of lost time.



- 2 So. Much. Paper.** — Most companies still have to process archaic paper invoices. This leads to bottlenecks, missing invoices, manual data entry, and a time-consuming (and expensive) audit process when paper invoices are archived.



- 3 Manual, tedious, and redundant work** — Paper-based processes mean that time is wasted on tasks like data entry instead of using that time to be strategic and proactive.



- 4 Confusion about payments** — Approximately 25% of an AP Manager's time is spent handling supplier inquiries about payments. This can be eliminated when suppliers have self-service access to their invoice process status.

The way we look at the accounts payable function in a business has changed. Cutting edge technology like artificial intelligence (AI), process automation, and analytics are empowering forward-thinking enterprises to transform their accounts payable department into strategic partners and even revenue centers.

Best-in-class accounts payable organizations are already using automation to their advantage and are planning for new ways to automate manual or repetitive processes to generate additional efficiencies. But of course, many accounts payable departments today struggle with outdated modes of doing business.

The top AP challenges businesses face with their AP processes include:

- High percentage of exceptions
- Invoice/payment approvals take too long

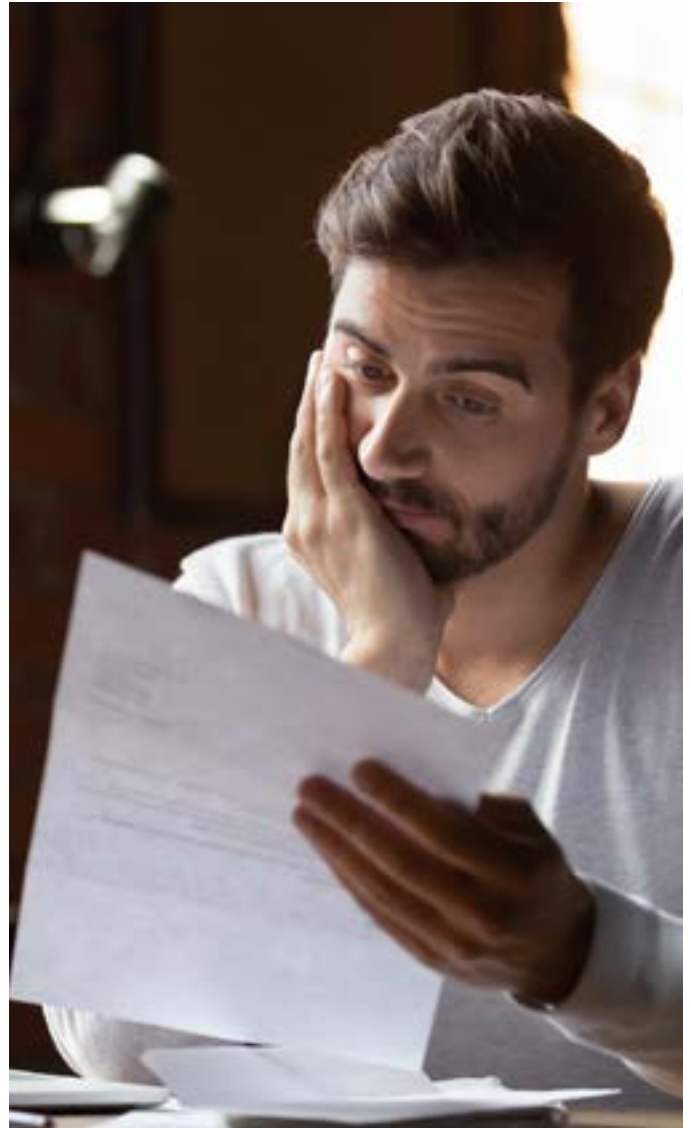
To build a compelling argument for automation with leadership, AP automation solutions need to prove that they can provide:

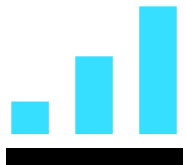
AP automation: your strategic sidekick

What are the benefits for AP automation?

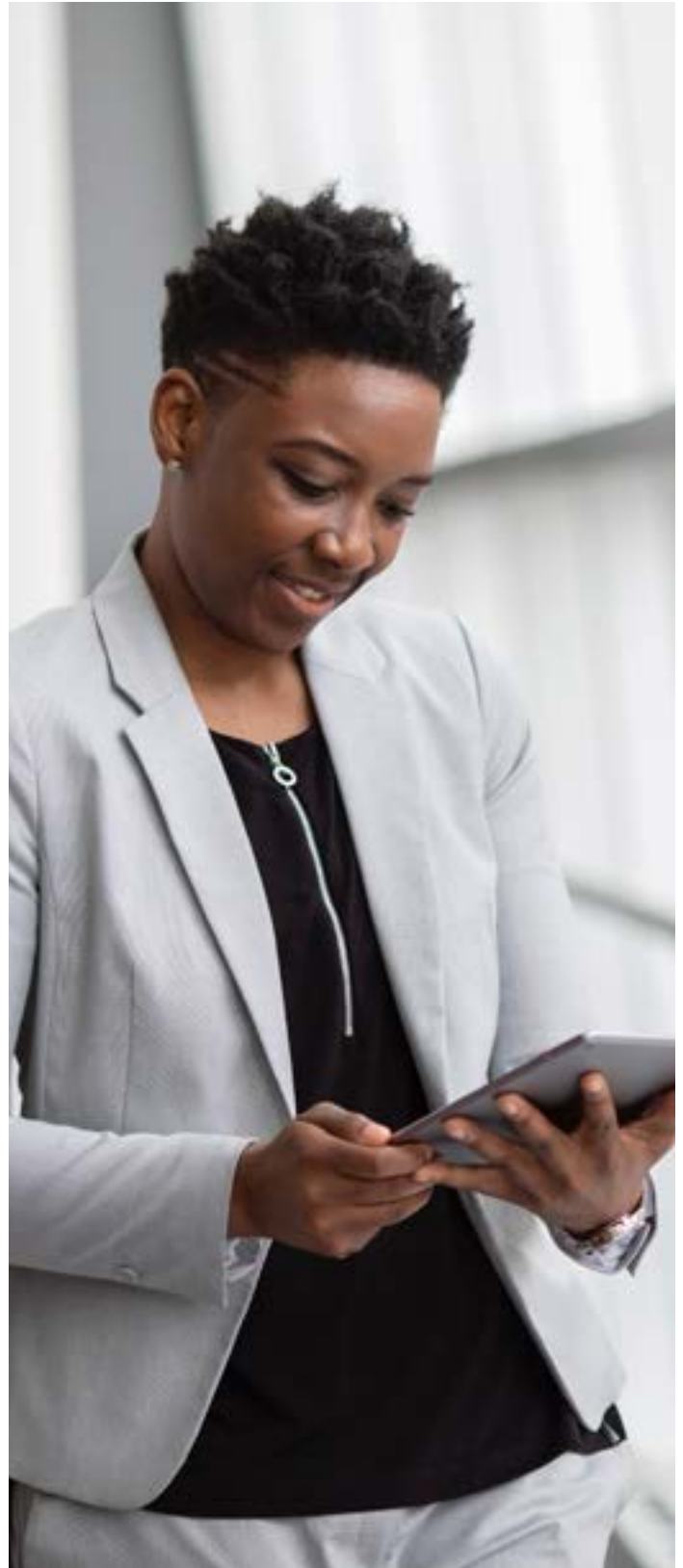
Accounts payable automation provides more control over the invoice handling process. Visibility and efficiency are also improved, typically yielding cost savings.

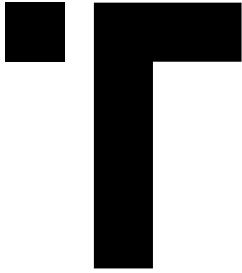
Who does AP automation benefit?
